- Submission Guidelines: Each EMS provider can submit one entry for consideration.
- Deadline: The 2019 EMS Week Essay Contest deadline is Friday, May 3, 2019. Entries received after midnight EST on that day will not be considered.
- The winner will be announced by Friday, May 10, 2019.
- Length: Essays should be no longer than 1,000 words. This is a *maximum* word count. Your response to the theme should be clearly and powerfully communicated.
- Eligibility: The contest is open to certified EMS providers with a residence or work affiliation in the EHSF region.
- Language: Essays should be written in English and represent the provider's original work.
- Winner: A panel of reviewers selected by the EHSF will judge entries and will award one winner. The winning essay will be featured on the EHSF website and presented at the 2019 EMS Leadership Breakfast hosted by the EHSF on Wednesday, May 22, 2019. Those receiving Honorable Mention will be featured on EHSF website and mentioned at the 2019 EMS Leadership Breakfast.
- Prizes: The winner will receive a \$500 cash prize and a certificate of recognition from the EHSF. Contestants who receive Honorable Mention will receive a certificate of recognition. For the winner, the cash prize will come in the form of a check. If the check expires or is lost, a cancellation fee will be deducted from the total when the check is re-issued.
- Evaluation Criteria: Each submission is read by at least three reviewers. Essays will be evaluated using the following criteria:
 - Addresses Prompt—The essay effectively takes into account the purpose of the theme. If an essay does not make an earnest attempt to address the contest's prompt, it will not be considered for review.
 - Focus—The thesis/main message is clear and supported throughout the essay. The essay does not stray from the main message.
 - Organization & Structure—The essay is organized and well-structured. Author demonstrates command of grammar, spelling, and mechanics.
 - Voice/Originality—The essay uses a highly engaging and personal style. The author finds fresh or interesting ways to convey ideas. The author approaches the topic from a unique perspective.
 - Evidence of Personal Reflection—The essay demonstrates that the author has genuinely explored the topic/question and how it relates to the EMS system. The essay reflects a depth in reflection.
